

The Heinlein Society has had a presence at <u>Balticon</u> for just about its entire existence. This year we were lucky to have Director Betsey Wilcox and Lifetime open in browser PRO version Are you a developer? Since last year's move to a new hotel, our blood drive has seen lower attendance than we'd like. Scheduling changes meant that the only available day for us to host the blood drive was, unfortunately, the last day of the Con. Undaunted, we still were able to collect 21 units. We gifted audio books to everyone who showed up, fruits of our continued partnership with the Heinlein for Heroes (H4H) program – audio books don't ship well overseas, so we were happy to share them with those who shared their blood with our drive. Our most recent H4H drive collected 39 books (eight by Heinlein!), which allows us to fulfill between one and two shipments.

In "Heinlein, Clarke, and Asimov – Are the Big Three Still Relevant?", one of the panels we hosted, the crowd was lively despite being packed standing-roomonly; our other panel, "Estate Planning for Fans" was also well-received. Howard Rosenblatt, a lawyer and newly appointed to the THS Board of Advisors, was instrumental in to that panel's success

The 2017 Heinlein Award was presented via video link to Robert J. Sawyer. Director Beatrice Kondo and her mother, Mrs. Ursula Kondo, made the presentation at the convention's opening ceremonies as they had a personal connection to Sawyer.



We spoke to a lot of wonderful fans and even signed up a few new members as a result of our outreach. BLOOD DRIVE UPDATES

- Balticon this year had 21 donors. Thanks to John Tilden for coordinating.
- <u>Kublacon</u> brought in 23 donors. Thanks to Carlin Black for coordinating, and to Christine Mahalas and Blood Centers of the Pacific for providing the Coach and Staff.
- InConJunction is back in business as an official THS drive, and just brought in another 23 donors! Many thanks to Brandon Spratt for managing the drive for the convention at the last minute. Thanks also to Kendra Henderson and Indiana Blood Center for the staff and the bloodmobile. Incidentally InConJunction has added over 200 units to our running total in past years.

From our Blood Drive Chair, Carlin Black:

I am ready to help anybody at any con set up a blood drive. I do all the coordinating with blood agencies. 6 month lead time is ideal; 3 months may be possible. The Con coordinator works with the Con Admins to set up space for the table and the drive, either bus parking or 1500 sq. feet in almost any convenient space: a curtained off unused end of the concourse, an unused admin room, or a free meeting room would all work. The coordinator also needs to find volunteers to draw a crowd to the table: cosplayers, buskers, popular attendees holding meetups, etc. All the volunteers need to know is where the bus is, and that Paying it Forward by a donation is a good thing. <u>Contact Carlin</u> to get a drive started or inquire about volunteering!


WORLDCON ACTIVITIES: 2017, 2018, AND 2019

2017: The 2017 World Science Fiction Convention ("Worldcon") will convene from 9-13 August 2017 at the Messukeskus Exposition & Convention Centre in Helsinki, Finland. Details can be found at the <u>Worldcon website</u>. Should you get the urge (and have the funds handy) to attend at the last minute, please be aware there is no central hotel, but about a dozen smaller hotels spread throughout the city.



2018: The 2018 Worldcon will convene from 16-20 August 2018 at the McEnery Convention Center in San Jose, California. Details and membership information can be found at the <u>2018 Worldcon website</u>. The principal hotels in San Jose will be the San Jose Marriott and the Hilton San Jose, and we anticipate a fair representation of Society people to attend.
