

...and that's even true for blood donation! Here a recounting by Susan Sackett (pictured below with Robert Heinlein) of blood donation experience:

I spoke at the Puget Sound Star Trekkers Science Fiction and Star Trek Convention II, in late January (probably the 30th) 1977 to promote the soonto-be-released "Star Trek" movie.

I knew Robert Heinlein was going to be there as a special guest speaker, and I eagerly looked forward to meeting him. I found him and his wife Ginny both very charming. I was surprised and delighted when he said he'd like a copy of my book, "Letters to "Star Trek." Of course I wanted his autograph too! I gave him a copy of my book, and he signed my copy of "Stranger in a Strange Land."

In return, I promised to give blood in his honor. (A Blood Drive was a tradition at all conventions attended by Robert, stemming from a time when donated blood had saved his life.) Imagine my surprise and delight while I was giving blood, when Robert stopped by to see me, and in appreciation for my donation, he gave me a kiss!





The year may be young, but we've already made 127 shipments, totaling 1,459 books distributed. Since the program's inception, we've sent 20,607 total books to our heroes.



The Heinlein For Heroes program (H4H) sends free books to troops, veterans, and military families. We send only to

individuals or units that have requested SF material. Clearly many of our military men and women WANT to read good science fiction, including Heinlein. To meet that demand, our shipments go around the globe, as well as to veterans' hospitals here at home.

Contributions keep coming in, but your help is still needed. We need gently used paperbacks—and especially Heinleins, as we include Heinlein books in every shipment.

Money contributions are used to buy books wherever we find them (book dealers, eBay) at the right price. But free is even better than cheap. Is an SF friend or neighbor downsizing? You can help them and help us!
