To promote the legacy of Robert A. Heinlein by encouraging the reading and discussion of his written work, the use of critical thinking skills in our daily lives, and a love of science



The board chartered a financial committee in late 2022 with a first version of a corporate Investment Policy.


The Committee, consisting of President Tilden, Treasurer Kondo, Asst. Treasurer Rule, and Director Davis, met several times in January 2023 to revise and finalize the Investment Policy and set guidelines for our Scholarship fund investment with an eye towards growth. Those changed policies and investments were put into action within our Fidelity account and reported back to the board. Periodic reports have been made to the board since then and additional donations are being invested proportionally according to our policy.


Our Scholarship Fund is our only investment subaccount. We started with \$40,000 from savings and directed FY22 donations. As of September 2, 2023, we have a rounded figure of \$144,453.00 invested from additional donations that is dedicated for Scholarships. Our announced goal for the fund is to reach \$400,000 through donations or growth to be able to award our present scholarships without relying on yearly donations.

The Heinlein Society offers three membership levels:

Lifetime Membership is \$750.00. You have or will receive a coupon discount code for new issues of *The Heinlein Journal*! Life Members receive ALL back and new issues free with their appropriate code.

Regular Membership is \$45.00/year. Your automatically renewing yearly membership payment of \$45.00 goes to support our programs: Blood Drives, Heinlein For Heroes, Scholarships, and Education. Thank you for joining us to Pay It Forward! By joining The Heinlein Society, and setting up this account, you agree to receive our bimonthly email newsletter and other membership communications. Your email address and information will not be sold or shared.

Changes to Membership 2023

We have been making many changes for the better this year. Some of the changes have given us better confidence in our membership totals, which improves our budgeting and spending.

So, for the end of FY 2023 we proudly report that we have a total of 850 members, which looks like a huge decrease in numbers from last year. The potentially artificial decrease maybe due to change in accounting, so a 29% decrease over previous FY (+245) sounds like a lot but we are not concerned at this time.

Our End FY 2023 Lifetime Membership is at 89 which is an 18% increase over previous FY (+16). We continue to engage in successful Social Media outreach through Facebook,

reach through Facebook, Instagram and Twitter and currently have over 300,000 followers on FB.






Dr. Herb Gilliland, Editor



2023 Scholarships Awarded

The growth of our scholarship program continues to be astounding. This year we received 744 applications, up from 567 in 2022. Likewise, our number of international applicants increased to 84, including 15 who had multiple citizenship. The international applicants hailed from 28 different countries across the globe.

Our demographic information continues to be diverse. We still have far more female than male applicants. This year we had 552 female, 131 male, 4 non-binary and 55 who made no selection or declined to state. Ethnically our numbers were: 375 White, 87 Black, 84 Asian, 71 Hispanic, 9 Middle Eastern, 1 Native American, 1 Pacific Islander, 44 multi-racial and 70 who made no entry. Applicants who supplied their age ranged from 16 to 38 years old.

With such a large field there were many excellent applicants, so being named among our ten finalists was no mean feat. Becoming one of the four awardees was even harder.

Four Winners of \$4,000 each

Rhiannon Red Bird – Rhiannon is the winner of this year's Robert A.

Heinlein Scholarship. In the fall she will begin her senior year at California Polytechnic State University—Humbolt. She is majoring in Cellular and Molecular Biology with a Chemistry Minor. After completing her undergraduate degree, Rhiannon hopes to spend time in a research lab and eventually pursue a postgraduate degree in Veterinary or Human Medicine.

Nine Reed-Mera – Nine is this year's Virginia "Ginny"

Heinlein Scholarship recipient. She has a double major of Biological Sciences and Written Arts, entering her Senior year at Bard College.

Nine began college at age 16 and has maintained a 4.0 GPA. She has received numerous scholastic awards, including a National Silver Medal. She was awarded a Mellon Foundation grant to study extremophiles.

Kenji Sakaie – Kenji is the Dr. Yoji Kondo Scholarship winner. He is an incoming Freshman at Franklin W. Olin College of Engineering, majoring in Mechanical Engineering. Kenji is interested in working in the aerospace or naval architecture industries, working toward a goal of providing safe, affordable, and sustainable housing through the prefabricated building industry

Victoria Woods - Victoria wins this year's Dr. Jerry Pournelle Scholarship. In the upcoming academic year she will be a Sophomore at Trinity College Dublin, majoring in Geography and Geoscience. Last summer, Victoria interned studying the detection limits of hyperspectral sensors and is doing ongoing research in gamma ray spectrometry. She is active in her college's Environmental Society and International Students Club

Paying it Forward with Time Donations

The Heinlein Society is a non-profit organization run by volunteers. With the number of applications for scholarships going up every year, the committee finds itself in need of even more volunteer readers.

You don't have to have an academic background to volunteer. We have training sessions on what to look for both good and bad. We have always run the essays through a plagiarism program, but this year found that we needed to include AI written paper detection software. It was very sobering to find that 70% of our applicants had 30% or more of their essay content AI generated. We will be warning applicants next year that we will be checking all applications for plagiarism and AI generation.


