
What I am Reading 16.0

Martha Wells-System Collapse: The Murderbot Diaries, Book 7; HC, Kindle, Audible

Following the events in **Network Effect**, Murderbot finds itself not quite right and not operationally up to snuff. Missing some of its armor and maybe a few screws it must figure out what is wrong, fix it, save the human colonists it is trying to protect while not giving itself away to a whole new group of SecUnits from a predatory corporation. If they can't have the planet, then they want to indenture (read enslave) the human colonists already on the planet. Murderbot and its family of ships and people work together to save the day. Martha Wells does it again and does it "well"





Grady Hendrix- The Southern Book Club's Guide to Slaying Vampires; HC, PB, Kindle, Audible

I got hooked on the title first, then the setting of the book (Charleston, SC area) and then the characters. I was having a rollicking time with the familiar female characters until the southern husbands stuck their noses and moralities into the story. I just wanted to slap them all silly for relegating the females to the "do as I say" obedient southern wife. Three years pass in time, and we are spared the gory details of that time, picking back up as the women return to their senses and start planning to kill the vampire in their midst who is threatening their children's lives. It was a completely satisfying end to a late 20th century southern novel. I am hoping to read the next novel, **How to Sell a Haunted House,** soon.

Lois McMaster Bujold- Demon Daughter; Kindle, Audio CD, Audible (March 2024)

The newest Penric and Desdemona, World of the Five God's novella does not disappoint. When a six-year old girl is accidentally joined to an elemental demon on a wooden sailing ship and proceeds to get thrown overboard because she can't stop starting fires, Pen and Des come to the rescue. Familiar characters appear, including the White God and his Saint, Nikys and Penric's children, and a wider understanding of demons. I think this is book 12 in the series and I am really hoping the Subterranean Press will also publish this volume. This is an easy reading page turner.

We need local blood drive coordinators for the South Bay, San Francisco and Oakland, and Marin County. Also New England Coordinators are a critical need.

Coordinators in other areas are great. And Library Blood drives may soon become a Heinlein Society program so that there will be plenty for a coordinator to do. Cons may not be the only option.

Coordinating a blood drive is relatively easy. The blood center does most of the work before the drive. Except for the days of the drive, it is not time consuming. The rewards are huge. Each Unit of blood coordinated saves 3 lives at local hospitals. Best of all, you do not need to be eligible to donate to coordinate a drive. Even those with a fear of needles can Pay it Forward by coordinating a drive.




