## 2024 Heinlein Award



Tom Doherty, founder of TOR Books and Chair of Tom Doherty Associates, publishing under the Tor, Forge, Tordotcom, Starscape, Tor Teen, and Nightfire imprints, is the 2024 winner of the Robert A. Heinlein Award. The award is bestowed for outstanding published works in science fiction and technical writings that inspire the human exploration of space. This award is in recognition of Mr. Doherty's work in bringing the inspiring books of hundreds of authors writing about our future in Space to public awareness.

The Heinlein Society is honor Mr. Doherty with a dinner at Balticon. Limited reservations are available for the dinner. Price and menu are still in the planning stage.

Tom has previously been awarded the Skylark award in 1993, a Lifetime Achievement Award at the 2005 World Fantasy Convention, the Raymond Z. Gallun award in 2006) for outstanding contribution to science fiction, the 2007 Lariat Award, the 2009 Solstice Award from SFFWA, and 2017 brought the Thriller Legend Award from the International Thriller Writers. Obviously, the Heinlein Award puts a crown on all those other awards! ;-)

The award will be formally presented during opening ceremonies on Friday, May 24, 2024, 8:00 PM, for Balticon 58, the 58th Maryland Regional Science Fiction Convention. Balticon will take place at the Renaissance Baltimore Harborplace Hotel in Baltimore Maryland. Mr. Doherty will participate in the Balticon program across Memorial Day Weekend.

Balticon and the Heinlein Award are both managed and sponsored by The Baltimore Science Fiction Society, Inc. BSFS thanks The Heinlein Society and the family of Dr. Yoji Kondo for providing funding for this award.

The Robert A. Heinlein Award is a sterling silver medallion bearing the image of Robert A. Heinlein, as depicted by artist Arlin Robins. The medallion is matched with a red-white-blue lanyard. In addition, the winner receives two lapel pins for use when a large medallion is impractical, and a plaque describing the award for home or office wall display.

The Robert A. Heinlein Award selection committee consists of science fiction writers and was founded by Dr. Yoji Kondo, a long-time friend of Robert and Virginia Heinlein. Members of the original committee were approved by Virginia Heinlein.

Virginia Heinlein authorized multiple awards in memory of her husband. Other awards include the Heinlein Prize, which is fully funded by Virginia Heinlein's estate, and a National Space Society award for volunteer projects.

### An Award for Bill Shatner

William Shatner will appear at the National Space Society's 2024 conference in May to accept the Robert A Heinlein Memorial Award. The award honors "those individuals who have made significant, lifetime contributions to the creation of a free space faring civilization" for his dramatic and wide reaching influence on public perceptions of space exploration and development via his decades of Star Trek experiences. Star Trek creator Gene Roddenberry received the Heinlein Award in 1993.


And we have a **Donor Wall** page online.

Coordinators in other areas are great. And Library Blood drives may soon become a Heinlein Society program so that there will be plenty for a coordinator to do. Cons may not be the only option.

Coordinating a blood drive is relatively easy. The blood center does most of the work before the drive. Except for the days of the drive, it is not time consuming. The rewards are huge. Each Unit of blood coordinated saves 3 lives at local hospitals. Best of all, you do not need to be eligible to donate to coordinate a drive. Even those with a fear of needles can Pay it Forward by coordinating a drive.




